Dear Advisor:

The San Diego Association of Black Journalists (SDABJ) is proud to offer our annual SDABJ Journalism Scholarship Program to assist San Diego area high school and college students who are interested in journalism to advance their education.

SDABJ will offer the following scholarships:

- 1. \$3,000 scholarship to a college journalism student at a 4-year institution**
- 2. \$1,500 scholarship to a college journalism student at a 4-year institution**
- 3. \$1,000 scholarship to a high school student planning to pursue a journalism or related career at a 4-year institution**
- 4. \$500 scholarship to a journalism student at a community college**
- 5. A scholarship worth \$40-50,000 to National University good for tuition for four years at the School of Media and Communications**

Applicants must be U. S. citizens with financial need, who attend or plan to attend universities or colleges and major in print or broadcast journalism, English or Mass Communications. All scholarships will be nonrenewable.

The application requires that candidates indicate how the students plan to ensure that the African-American community's voice be heard in the mainstream media. Applicants must receive two letters of recommendation from a school administrator, counselor or teacher, community organization or church. If the applicant is less than 18 years of age, a parent or guardian **must** sign the application. This will indicate that they approve the release of the student's name or photo for promotion of the SDABJ Journalism Scholarship program.

Completed applications must be received no later than March 10, 2008. The finalists will be contacted and interviewed by our scholarship panel. Our intent is to announce the winners no later than **March 20th**. Finalists will be contacted with a date and time to be interviewed by our scholarship panel.

The San Diego Association of Black Journalists is one of the newer chapters of the National Association of Black Journalists (NABJ). NABJ is an organization of journalists, students and communications professionals that provides quality programs and services to and advocates on behalf of black journalists worldwide. NABJ is the largest organization of journalists of color in the world. In 2003, SDABJ was honored with the NABJ Salute of Excellence, "Chapter of the Year" award.

SDABJ SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS -

The San Diego Association of Black Journalists Scholarship Program offers the following scholarships:

- 1. \$3,000 scholarship to a college journalism student at a 4-year institution**
- 2. \$1,500 scholarship to a college journalism student at a 4-year institution**
- 3. \$1,000 scholarship to a high school student planning to pursue a journalism or related career at a 4-year institution**
- 4. \$500 scholarship to a journalism student at a community college**
- 5. A scholarship worth \$40-50,000 to National University good for tuition for four years at the School of Media and Communications**

Scholarship funds will be distributed to colleges and universities where they can be used for books and tuition. Students will not receive cash. Proof of enrollment will be required.

Applications must be postmarked no later than March 10, 2008. Partial or incomplete submittals will not be reviewed. Successful applicants will be contacted soon after.

Seniors attending San Diego area high schools planning to major in print or broadcast journalism, English or Mass Communications are eligible to apply. Additionally, applicants must be U.S. citizens and show financial need. Applicants must be planning to attend, or already be

accepted to a university or college. Applicants must be able to detail in writing how they plan to make sure the African-American voice is heard in the mainstream media. The checklist is as follows:

1. **Application Form** - Complete and sign the attached application forms. All sections must be completed. If a block or section does not apply write "N/A".
2. **Transcript** - Attach a copy of your high school or college transcript. The transcript should be current as of your previous semester.
3. **Biographical Sketch** – Prepare and sign a brief biographical sketch of yourself that explains your reason for requesting financial assistance. It must be double-spaced and must not exceed 200 words.
4. **Essay** – Prepare and sign a brief essay that discusses how you plan to bridge the gap between the African- American community and the media. It should be double-spaced and must not exceed 300 words.
5. **Work Examples** (optional) – Students may send examples of their work with high school newspapers and or TV programs. The work will **not** be returned.
